Irony: There are three different kinds of irony o Verbal irony occurs when the opposite of what is said is actually meant (sarcasm is an extreme form of verbal irony) o Situational irony occurs when an event occurs that is the opposite of what was expected by the character and/or reader o Dramatic irony is when a character says something
